

From Fr Mani's desk: 1st Sunday of Lent (B)

Often when we think of Lent the immediate thoughts coming to our mind are fasting, abstinence, self- denial, repentance etc. which are bit unpleasant. But in fact, Lent is something to be enjoyed and not to be endured. Lent once again offers us an opportunity to leave our past behind and renew our life once again.

Sometimes we may feel bad that we did not fulfil the resolutions made last year. But the truth - life is a series of new beginnings. Look at the farmer he plants new seeds every year though the harvest may not be up to his expectation but in the right season he plants the seeds again with new hope. Let us sow the seeds of God's word, His kingdom deep in our hearts during this Lent that we can reap Easter fruits in abundance.

The promise God made to Noah (1st reading) "Never again shall a flood destroy all mortal beings" is fulfilled when Jesus died on the cross and rose again. This is the good news we grow into during this Lent. Let us try to be in the ark separating ourselves from the flood of evil. St Peter says in the 2nd reading, "This is why Christ died for our sins once and for all so that he could lead you to God". That means whatever is our experience of sin that is not to be our final story. God intends life for us and not death.

Lent is a training period through our desert experience as Christ had for forty days. There are desert areas in our lives where decisions are needed, and resolutions must be made. Christ is asking us to see ourselves as we really are and to rid ourselves of anything ungodly and unchristian. Fasting from our selfish and self- centred impulses and inclinations help us to make room in our hearts for God.

'Repent and believe in the gospel' was the words used when ash was imposed on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday. Repentance is the key word of the gospel. Repentance for our past sins alone can remove the baggage of our life and help us make a U turn towards God. 'Repentance turns the water of our tears into the wine of his divine love'. By self-discipline and a change of heart from our past sins, we become even more receptive to serving and promoting the kingdom of God.

Let us begin this Lent with enthusiasm because although what we do for Lent – our fasting, abstinence, prayer and works of charity – may seem to be small, but they are important victories for the Kingdom of God and defeat the evils lurking in us. So let us make love not war with Lent. In love there is always one who kisses, and another offers the cheek. Lent offers its cheek but are we prepared to kiss?

St Francis de Sales prayed, "Thy kingdom come. Father in my body and soul is your kingdom. You desire to reign in this kingdom. I surrender it to you. I give it to you. May it be truly yours since it really is yours. May I not usurp it, may I not deliver it up to Satan, to the world nor to the flesh, which are cruel tyrants but to you who is its true Lord. Reign from now on in my soul and in my memory".



IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP ANTHONY FISHER

As you would well know, euthanasia and assisted suicide

has been in operation in NSW for three months. I said at the time that its implementation was a very dark day for our state and that remains true.

Proponents of these laws continue to argue providing the so-called 'choice' of euthanasia and assisted suicide provide to some would not affect the choice of others.

However, a change in law always has an impact on others and the choices available to them.

In the 2023-2024 NSW Budget, \$150 million was cut from the previously allocated budget for palliative care in this state. The flow on effect from fewer resources being allocated to palliative care is that fewer people will be able to access it.

In the very same budget, almost \$100 million of new funding was allocated to the implementation of euthanasia and assisted suicide.

I encourage you to please <u>sign</u> <u>this petition</u>, asking for the full funding to be restored.


