A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark (Mark 9:2-10)

Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 



Amongst them were our own candidates Gary, Eva, Brad and Melissa, along with their sponsors and the RCIA team.



### IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP ANTHONY FISHER

As you would well know, euthanasia and assisted suicide has been in operation in NSW for three months. I said at the time that its implementation was a very dark day for our state and that remains true.

Proponents of these laws continue to argue providing the so-called 'choice' of euthanasia and assisted suicide provide to some would not affect the choice of others.

However, a change in law always has an impact on others and the choices available to them.

In the 2023-2024 NSW Budget, \$150 million was cut from the previously allocated budget for palliative care in this state. The flow on effect from fewer resources being allocated to palliative care is that fewer people will be able to access it.

In the very same budget, almost \$100 million of new funding was allocated to the implementation of euthanasia and assisted suicide.

I encourage you to please <u>sign this petition</u>, asking for the full funding to be restored.


