THE EASTER VIGIL IN THE HOLY NIGHT 30 March 2024 Year B/2–Divine office Psalter Week 1

The **Easter Vigil** is the most important celebration of our faith. In this celebration we await and welcome the Risen Lord and we celebrate our rebirth in Christ and the gift of our faith. The whole ceremony has **four elements**:

Liturgy of Light: With the lighting of the Paschal Candle and the singing of the Exsultet, the great hymn of praise.

Liturgy of the Word: We listen to the story of salvation through readings from the Old Testament. The full liturgy has seven Old Testament readings. We use three. The Gloria follows these readings and then the readings of the Mass set out below, are proclaimed.

Liturgy of Baptism: We bless the baptismal water.

Liturgy of the Eucharist: We then move into the more familiar part of the Mass with the procession of gifts, the Eucharistic prayer and then the distribution of Holy Communion.

Readings: Gen 1:1 - 2:2Ex 14:15 - 15:1 Ez 36:16-28

Epistle: Rom 6:3-11

<u>Gospel</u>

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark (Mark 16:1-7)

When the sabbath was over, Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices with which to go and anoint him. And very early in the morning on the first day of the week they went to the tomb, just as the sun was rising.

They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' But when they looked they could see that the stone – which was very big – had already been rolled back. On entering the tomb they saw a young man in a white robe seated on the right hand side, and they were struck with amazement. But he said to them, 'There is no need for alarm. You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified: he has risen, he is not here. See, here is the place where they laid him. But you must go and tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going before you to Galilee; it is there you will see him, just as he told you.""

First Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 10:34. 37-43)

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.' The Word of the Lord

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (Jn 20:1-9) It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

NSW Conversion Practices Bill

As you may be aware, the NSW Government tabled a bill to ban so-called conversion therapy in Parliament on Wednesday.

While everyone can support laws that genuinely aim to prohibit coercive actions that violate the dignity of the human person, bans on so-called conversion practices can sometimes have the effect – intended or unintended – of outlawing religious teaching, prayer and practice or preventing people from seeking and obtaining the help they desire to live in accordance with their beliefs.

The bill proposed by the Government provides some protections for religious leaders and parents seeking to raise their children in faith, but still has some gaps that unfortunately mean the proposed law encroaches too far into faith and family.

The Archdiocese of Sydney, along with a number of other faith communities, have proposed some reasonable amendments to make sure the proposed law does not do unintended damage to freedoms. These amendments should have been included in the original bill but were not, so I need your assistance to make sure our MPs know they are important.

Using the contactyourmp.org.au website, can you please send a message to your local MP and ask for their support for these reasonable amendments?

The government wants to pass this bill this week, so please act now.



Divine Mercy Sunday

Holy Family Catholic Church Menai will celebrate the feast of Divine Mercy, everyone is welcome to receive in great abundance the gifts of His resurrection.

> The Second Sunday of Easter would be called "Divine Mercy Sunday" as desired by Jesus and expressed through St. Faustina. The late Pope St. John Paul II said, "Divine Mercy! Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy". (Diary, 687)

The souls that say this chaplet will be embraced by My mercy during their lifetime and especially at the hour of their death" (Diary, 754).

'At the hour of their death, I defend as My own glory every soul that will say this chaplet: or when others say it for a dying person, the indulgence is the same' (Diary, 811).
