IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP ANTHONY FISHER

As you would well know, euthanasia and assisted suicide has been in operation in NSW for three months. I said at the time that its implementation was a very dark day for our state and that remains true.

Proponents of these laws continue to argue providing the so-called 'choice' of euthanasia and assisted suicide provide to some would not affect the choice of others.

However, a change in law always has an impact on others and the choices available to them.

In the 2023-2024 NSW Budget, \$150 million was cut from the previously allocated budget for palliative care in this state. The flow on effect from fewer resources being allocated to palliative care is that fewer people will be able to access it.



In the very same budget, almost \$100 million of new funding was allocated to the **[** implementation of euthanasia and assisted suicide.

HOMILY POINTS: Deacon Sone


The Prophet Jeremiah recounts the unfaithfulness of Israel in their Covenant with God Almighty. And so, he prophesied the new and everlasting Covenant. This Covenant will be different, it will bring in an age of encounter with God who would become man. They will truly know Him not only in knowledge and in the law, but in our own hearts. Therefore, we shouldn't make any excuses for not knowing or having a relational communion with God, right? Wrong!

Throughout our Lenten readings from the first week till now, the Jewish religious authorities have been hell-bent on denying Jesus as the Messiah, as the Lord who, as Jeremiah proclaimed, "They will know me." Yet, they know of him only in writing. But do not know deeply who He is spiritually and whole-heartedly. They study the scripture as Jesus said, yet they do not know Him.

At times, we all can be like this. Modern day "Christians", which also includes us Catholics, will recount who Jesus is but will not encounter Him or fail to be deeply rooted in our relationship with Him. This should not happen to us Catholics because, not only are we founded by Him, yes, Our Church is founded by Jesus Christ, but we have the visible signs of His love for us in the Sacraments. We encounter Him daily through the Word of Scripture and within the tiny Host in our Eucharistic sacrifice where He is TRULY present. Not only this, our Saints, our Church Fathers, men, and women of great times past, have died and given their life for the TRUTH of Jesus Christ, and their deep communion with Him. Our Catholic faith embodies the whole of us, body and soul, wisdom and intellect, heart, and mind, raised up to God, to know Him, to Love Him, and Serve Him through His Son our Lord Jesus Christ.

My dear friends, we should, therefore, not be bench warmer Catholics, for as St Paul wrote, "Christ offered prayer and entreaty". Through His sacrifice He has made perfect all things so that we can participate in His plan of Salvation. Our Salvation requires relationship with the Son of God. Our relationship requires our very act of encountering. And our encounter must be far deeper than surface level.

As we continue our Lenten journey, may we persevere and follow Him into the Garden of Gethsemane. May we remain steadfast in the truth of Christ remain constant in prayer. And may this Lent, deepen our knowledge and relationship of Him, the Son of God, who is to be glorified. May we be grains of wheat against the winds of anti-Christian modernism and progressive intolerance towards the Church and the harvest of truth she yields. May all of us be drawn to Him who will be lifted up for our sake. Amen.




