ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.

First Reading

A reading from the book of Exodus (Ex 12:1-8. 11-14)

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, 'This month is to be the first of all the others for you, the first month of your year. Speak to the whole community of Israel and say, "On the tenth day of this month each man must take an animal from the flock, one for each family: one animal for each household. If the household is too small to eat the animal, a man must join with his neighbour, the nearest to his house, as the number of persons requires. You must take into account what each can eat in deciding the number for the animal. It must be an animal without blemish, a male one year old; you may take it from either sheep or goats. You must keep it till the fourteenth day of the month when the whole assembly of the community of Israel shall slaughter it between the two evenings. Some of the blood must then be taken and put on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses where it is eaten. That night, the flesh is to be eaten, roasted over the fire; it must be eaten with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. You shall eat it like this: with a girdle round your waist, sandals on your feet, a staff in your hand. You shall eat it hastily; it is a passover in honour of the Lord. That night, I will go through the land of Egypt and strike down all the first-born in the land of Egypt, man and beast alike, and I shall deal out punishment to all the gods of Egypt, I am the Lord. The blood shall serve to mark the houses that you live in. When I see the blood I will pass over you and you shall escape the destroying plague when I strike the land of Egypt. This day is to be a day of remembrance for you, and you must celebrate it as a feast in the Lord's honour. For all generations you are to declare it a day of festival, for ever."

It was before the festival of the Passover, and Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to pass from this

world to the Father. He had always loved those who were his in the world, but now he showed how perfect his love was.

They were at supper, and the devil had already put it into the mind of Judas Iscariot son of Simon, to betray him. Jesus knew that the Father had put everything into his hands, and that he had come from God and was returning to God, and he got up from table, removed his outer garment and, taking a towel, wrapped it round his waist; he then poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel he was wearing.

He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, 'Lord, are you going to wash my feet?' Jesus answered, 'At the moment you do not know what I am doing, but later you will understand.' 'Never!' said Peter. 'You shall never wash my feet.' Jesus replied, 'If I do not wash you, you can have nothing in



common with me.' 'Then, Lord,' said Simon Peter, 'not only my feet, but my hands and my head as well!' Jesus said, 'No one who has taken a bath needs washing, he is clean all over. You too are clean, though not all of you are.' He knew who was going to betray him, that was why he said, 'though not all of you are.'

When he had washed their feet and put on his clothes again he went back to the table. 'Do you understand' he said 'what I have done to you? You call me Master and Lord, and rightly; so I am. If I, then, the Lord and Master, have washed your feet, you should wash each other's feet. I have given you an example so that you may copy what I have done to you.'

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Feet and Bread: Necessities for the Journey

Jesus is the body language of God. He is Who God is living a fully human life. Stripped of his tunic with a towel girding his waist, his disciples could see his heart beating, divine energy pulsing into the world – as menial service.

Our Lord knows who we really are, not our imaginary selfportrait, our face to the world, but who we are at ground level where our feet can be somewhat dirty and embarrassing. He wants to wash us clean, soothe and refresh us, so that we can better follow him on the Way.

And he commands us, if we purport to be his followers, to wash and soothe and refresh the feet of others so they may better journey through life. Pope Francis memorably did this by washing the feet of prisoners, two of whom were women, one of whom was Muslim. Can we doubt that this helped their rehabilitation?

The further gift of the Last Supper, recorded in the other gospels, is the food necessary to nourish and sustain us on our journey. The Risen Lord in his glorified body enters into the most intimate communion with our bodies down to our very toes.

We could take a moment to pray that we might, like Pope Francis, be the presence of the serving, soothing, refreshing God in the lives of those who need us, setting their feet on the path to a happier and fuller life.

NSW Conversion Practices Bill

As you may be aware, the NSW Government tabled a bill to ban so-called conversion therapy in Parliament on Wednesday.

While everyone can support laws that genuinely aim to prohibit coercive actions that violate the dignity of the human person, bans on so-called conversion practices can sometimes have the effect – intended or unintended – of outlawing religious teaching, prayer and practice or preventing people from seeking and obtaining the help they desire to live in accordance with their beliefs.

The bill proposed by the Government provides some protections for religious leaders and parents seeking to raise their children in faith, but still has some gaps that unfortunately mean the proposed law encroaches too far into faith and family.

The Archdiocese of Sydney, along with a number of other faith communities, have proposed some reasonable amendments to make sure the proposed law does not do unintended damage to freedoms. These amendments should have been included in the original bill but were not, so I need your assistance to make sure our MPs know they are important.

Using the contactyourmp.org.au website, can you please send a message to your local MP and ask for their support for these reasonable amendments?

The government wants to pass this bill this week, so please act now.

Thank you for continuing to support me in protecting faith and family life.



Timeline of Jesus' Death

HOLY THURSDAY

In the morning Jesus sends Peter and John to prepare the Passover meal. Towards the afternoon he goes to Jerusalem for the meal accompanied by the rest of the apostles.

7pm The Last Supper:

Washing of the feet.

Announcement of Judas' betrayal and Peter's denial.

Institution of the Eucharist.

The long discourse after the supper.

10pm To Gethsemane. Prayer of Jesus.

11pm Arrest of Jesus.

He is taken to Annas first and then to Caiaphas the High Priest.

Non-official trial and condemnation.

Denials of Peter.

Jesus is left to the will of the servants of the High Priest who abuse him till early morning.

GOOD FRIDAY

6am Gathering of the Sanhedrin and official condemnation of Jesus to death.

9am Jesus is handed over to Pilate; first part of the trial.

He is then taken to Herod, and brought back to Pilate.

Second part of the trial.

11am Jesus is condemned by Pilate.

He is scourged and crowned with thorns.

Journey to Calvary.

12pm noon Jesus is nailed to the cross.

The three hours agony.

3pm Jesus dies on the cross.

Joseph of Arimathaea asks Pilate for the body of Jesus.

Nicodemus brings ointments for the burial.

5pm Provisional burial of Jesus.

HOLY SATURDAY

The body of Jesus rests in the tomb.

The tomb is sealed and a guard posted at the entrance.

EASTER SUNDAY

5am RESURRECTION OF JESUS.

The women go to the tomb to complete the burial of Jesus.

Finding it empty Mary runs to give the news to the apostles.

Peter and John rush to the tomb.

Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene and to the women.

Some time later in the day he appears to Peter.

3pm Jesus joins the two disciples going to Emaaus.

5pm The two disciples recognise Jesus as he blessed and broke the bread.

They rush to Jerusalem to convey the news to the rest of the apostles.

9pm Jesus appears to the apostles gathered together (minus Thomas).
