They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. From Fr Mani's desk...

Ordinary time and the wedding at Cana

We all know that life is not all celebrations- Christmas and New Year celebrations are over and many of us are back to normal life. As St Paul said there is a time for everything. We are in the Ordinary time of the liturgy. Life is lived mostly in the ordinary time or ordinary way. People are born in ordinary time, grow up in ordinary time, marry in ordinary time, have families in ordinary time. People age in ordinary time and die in ordinary time.

Though our ordinary time is not filled with outstanding activities; it is filled with reality – the reality of sin and grace. It is here that we need the Lord more. Liturgical color itself is green and green represents life and growth. We got to live up to and bring to fruition what we celebrated at Christmas.

This Sunday we see the first miracle of Jesus according to John's gospel, the marriage at Cana where Jesus is revealing his Divine power. Here Jesus blesses the human marriage with his presence and making it a sacrament. We must pray for God's daily miracles in our families in this ordinary time.

Let us invite Jesus and Mary to remain with us when we feel shortages in our family lives. The spouses need them when their dreams are gone, mutual love seems dried up, relationships become boring and raising the children becomes a burden.

The whole atmosphere of stress and shame of the family is changed into joy because the people were ready to follow the instruction of Mary, "Do whatever he tells you". This is the only command given by Mary and it is a condition for miracles in our families. Jesus will tell us what we should do in the silence of our hearts if we are ready to listen to him.

Jesus asked the servants to fill the empty jars with water and Jesus could change it into the best wine, let us fill the empty hearts around us with love, mercy and concern to those around us.

There is the miracle at Cana taking place at every mass; the same Lord is transforming our gifts of bread and wine into hisown body and blood to give us the spiritual nourishment. If our families have lost the savor of mutual love, let us renew them at the altar with the power of the Holy Spirit.
