THE EASTER VIGIL IN THE HOLY NIGHT 19 April 2025 Year C/1—Divine office Psalter Week 1

The Easter Vigil is the most important celebration of our faith. In this celebration we await and welcome the Risen Lord and we celebrate our rebirth in Christ and the gift of our faith. The whole ceremony has four elements:

With the lighting of the Paschal Candle and the Liturgy of Light: singing of the Exsultet, the great hymn of praise.

Liturgy of the Word: We listen to the story of salvation through readings from the Old Testament. The full liturgy has seven Old Testament readings. We use three. The Gloria follows these readings and then the readings of the Mass set out below, are proclaimed.

Liturgy of Baptism: We bless the baptismal water.

Liturgy of the Eucharist: We then move into the more familiar part of the Mass with the procession of gifts, the Eucharistic prayer and then the distribution of Holy Communion.

Readings: Gen 1:1 - 2:2Ex 14:15 - 15:1 Ez 36:16-28

Epistle: Rom 6:3-11, Ps 117:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

<u>Gospel</u>

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (Luke 24:1-12)

On the first day of the week, at the first sign of dawn, the women went to the tomb with the spices they had prepared. They found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb, but on entering discovered that the body of the Lord Jesus was not there. As they stood there not knowing what to think, two men in brilliant clothes suddenly appeared at their side. Terrified, the women lowered their eyes. But the two men said to them, 'Why look among the dead for someone who is alive? He is not here; he has risen. Remember what he told you when he was still in Galilee: that the Son of Man had to be handed over into the power of sinful men and be crucified, and rise again on the third day?' And they remembered his words.

When the women returned from the tomb they told all this to the Eleven and to all the others. The women were Mary of Magdala, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James. The other women with them also told the apostles, but this story of theirs seemed pure nonsense, and they did not believe them.

Peter, however, went running to the tomb. He bent down and saw the binding cloths, but nothing else; he then went back home, amazed at what had happened.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

First Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 10:34. 37-43)

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Sequence

Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise. The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: he goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious king, thy mercy show!

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according **to John** (Jn 20:1-9)

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.



From Fr Mani's desk....

Resurrection of Jesus is the source of Christian life, and it was to teach us the meaning and mystery of our human life with all suffering and death that Jesus died for us and rose from death.

Jesus after his resurrection had told us, "Behold I am with you always, even to the end of the age." The Lord is with us in this particular time of our history to understand us and give us courage and hope to endure everything that comes in life.

Easter is not just a part of our belief or creed, "I believe in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting'. It is God's gift of understanding the fullness of life which is a gift to his followers. God our creator sent his son, and he taught us all about human and divine life that we are created to be with Him forever. For a Christian by death life is only changed not ended. We will be transformed to become part of his son's glorious body. Easter for us Christians is the revelation that death is not the last word, God is promising us that nothing good shall perish.

St Paul said, "Had he not risen from the dead, our faith would be in vain, our faith would be empty. God raised this Jesus and of this we are witnesses." (Cor15:14), Now it is our duty to the unbelieving world that there is a life after death. Let us believe it first so that we may understand the full meaning and depth of this truth.

I suppose you and I are here in an unusual way because we want to give ourselves to God. I will ask an honest question, and I want also an honest answer. After giving a gift to God, what do you expect from Him? Do you expect to be spared from all dangers and fears; or do you expect to win a game of safety and assurance of life, then, frankly speaking, you did not offer a gift, but you offer a bribe.

Is there enough proof of our life to show we are Christians? Since we are Christians, we should speak, think, love, serve and smile like Jesus especially in this most crucial and critical time of life. If we fail to do so, we fail as disciples of Jesus Christ. How can we rise with Him if we do not live His life?

The presence of bad times is usually the greatest temptation to feel God's absence but remember that various times in Bible times, God was there even in the midst of war, famine, flood and storms. God is with us always and promises to never leave us nor forsake us. This is the time to show our faith, hope and charity in a very real way. Happy Easter to all!
