Pope Francis

(1936 - 2025)

"When it happens, I will not be buried in Saint Peter's but at Santa Maria Maggiore: The Vatican is the home of my last service, not my eternal home. I will go in the room where they now keep the candelabra, close to the Regina della Pace from whom I have always sought help, and whose embrace I have felt more than a hundred times during the course of may papacy. They have confirmed that all is ready. The funeral service was excessive, so I have arranged with the master of ceremonies to lighten it: no catafalque, no ceremony for the closure of the casket, nor the deposition of the cypress casket into a second of lead and a third of oak. With dignity, but like any Christian, because the bishop of Rome is a pastor and a disciple, not a powerful man of this world.

Though I know that He has already given me many blessings, I ask the Lord for just one more: Look after me, let it happen whenever You wish, but, as You know, I'm not very brave when it comes to physical pain... So, please, don't make me suffer too much." (from the Autobiography of Pope Francis, Hope, 2025, p. 195)


From Fr Mani's desk....

Divine Mercy Sunday (2nd Sunday of Easter)

All the readings of today describe the mercy of God. In the Gospel, Thomas is the spokesman of the Apostles. The disciples, though lived with Jesus, witnessed to his miracles and heard his teachings for 3 years, still they could not believe that He was risen and was present with them. They looked for a visual or tangible experience of him. They doubted how the crucified and Risen Christ forgave them who betrayed and abandoned him when he wanted it most. But the Lord appeared to them and forgave their lack of faith in his mercy. Today we are no better than those Apostles. Jesus continues showing his acts of mercy down through the centuries through the church. Jesus needed his church to make his mercy alive and real in today's world. The church also needs Christ for the power to be the messenger of His love and mercy. The world is full of sin and evil and only the mercy of God can redeem it; the church exists to carry out this plan of Jesus today.

Late Pope Francis on Divine Mercy Sunday April 7, 2024, said, 'fulness of life is realized in Jesus, not through fleeting pleasures but through a deep relationship with Him. The faithful should fix their eyes on the crucified and risen Jesus, encountering him in the sacraments and prayer." Pope said that Divine Mercy Sunday, instituted by St. John Paul II is a time to embrace God's mercy and to become instruments of mercy in their communities.

In the image of Divine Mercy, as shown to St. Faustina, Jesus shows his hands and his side, pointing to the wounds of the Passion especially the wound in his heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity. The two rays as Jesus himself explained to St. Faustina, represent blood and water. It reminds us that when the soldier on Calvary pierced Christ's side with his spear, saw blood and water flowing from it. The blood recalls the sacrifice of the cross and the gift of the Eucharist; the water represents the baptism and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Our Lord made a special promise that he would grant complete pardon to the souls that would go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on this feast of Divine Mercy. St John Paul II said, "Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity at the dawn of the third millennium." Today it is in the mercy of God, the world will find peace and mankind will find happiness and there is no other hope for mankind.
