A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (John 21:1-19)
Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like

this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord', Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught,' Simon Peter went aboard and 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Then he said to him a third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was upset that he asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' and said, 'Lord, you know everything; you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep.
'I tell you most solemnly, when you were

'I tell you most solemnly, when you were young you put on your own belt and walked where you liked; but when you grow old you will stretch out your hands, and somebody else will put a belt round you and take you where you would rather not go? take you where you would rather not go.

In these words he indicated the kind of death by which Peter would give glory to God. After this he said, 'Follow me.'

# Some of the very personal and thoughtprovoking quotations of our late Pope Francis that we will never forget:

1. A "Field Hospital" for the WoundedH

"I see the Church as a field hospital after battle."

Francis believes the Church's first task is to heal wounds and warm hearts, not to judge or condemn. It should meet people where they are, especially in times of suffering, confusion, or sin.

# 2. A Church of the Poor

"I prefer a Church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets."

He wants a Church that is close to the people, especially the poor and marginalized—not obsessed with power, wealth, or bureaucracy.

# 3. A Missionary Church

"An evangelizing community knows that the Lord has taken the initiative... and it goes forth boldly."

Francis calls for a missionary conversion—a Church that goes out, rather than stays in. Its focus should be evangelization through joy, witness, and service.

# 4. A Church of Mercy, Not Moralism

"The thing the Church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful."

He warns against turning the Church into a rigid system of rules. Doctrine matters, but pastoral care and mercy must come first.

# 5. An Inclusive Church


"Who am I to judge?"

Spoken in reference to gay Catholics, this quote captures Francis' approach: everyone has dignity, and the Church must welcome all, especially those on the margins.

6. priests must be involved in the lives of their people

"This is what I am asking you - be shepherds with the smell of the sheep"

Pope spoke in his Chrism mass homily, March 28, 2013. Priests should be close enough to know the struggles, hopes and pains of the people they serve.
