Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'


From Fr Mani's desk...

This Sunday Church celebrates the solemnity of Pentecost, marking the end and the culmination of Easter season. Next Monday we go back to tenth week in ordinary time (year C). When the Apostles received the Holy Spirit in the form of fire (shape of tongue) and wind, they were completely overwhelmed and transformed. Until then, they were in the grip of fear, failure and inadequacy. Though the risen Lord had commanded them to preach the good news and be witnesses to him; they did not know where to start and how to do it. When the Holy Spirit came down on them on the fiftieth day of his Resurrection, the apostles started to preach about the Risen Lord so convincingly and passionately that on the first day itself 3000 men joined them and the first community of believers started to go out to the whole world.

It is said that there are now 34,000 Protestant denominations which means on the average, more than sixty-nine new denominations had sprung up every year since the Reformation in 1517. So whose birthday is it anyway? We can proudly say Pentecost is the birthday of the Church Jesus established 2,000 years ago and no evil power can prevail over it. It is the same Holy Spirit that gives life and guidance to the Church today. What a soul is to body, is the Holy Spirit to the Church and to a Christian. It is the Holy Spirit who keeps the Church warm and bright and burns away the debris as the fire does.

Pope Benedict XVI rightly said, "Even though we are God's *chosen people*, we often behave more like God's *frozen people*--frozen in our prayer life, frozen in the way we relate with one another, frozen in the way we celebrate our Faith."

Let us pray with Blessed Cardinal Newman, "Come Holy Spirit make our ears to hear; make our eyes to see; make our mouths to speak; make our hearts to seek; make our hands to reach out and touch the world with your love."


