





### From Fr Mani's desk...

## Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

All Semitic religions- Christianity, Judaism and Islam- believe in monotheism or in one God. But for us Christians, our faith is different: there is only one God and there are three persons in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit; they are equally powerful and yet they are different from each other in their functions: creator, redeemer and sanctifier.

The truth of the Trinity is not something that was discovered by some wise or holy men, nor is it a super discovery of science, nor something easy and comfortable to believe. It is a matter of faith because it is the way our God is revealed in the Bible and taught by Christ himself. In the 1<sup>st</sup> book of Bible, we read in the creation account God saying, "Let us make man in <u>our own</u> image" (Gen 1/26) It is the central mystery of Christian faith that all the three persons were present at the time of creation. God always was one in three and three in one. It will ever remain as a profound mystery.

If we are baptised and bless ourselves every time in the name of the Blessed Trinity and was created in the image of that Godhead, we got to model our life after that God. In the Trinity there is so much of love, harmony and give and take. There is so much of unity and transparency among them; none is superior or inferior to each other, they always co- exist. They are equal in majesty and undivided in splendor. Every Christian is called to belong to a community of people whether in the family or in the parish; helping and caring for each other; playing the god given functions honestly as mother or father or a child. Just as the Father renounces fully to Son and Son renounces entirely to Father and their mutual love and respect is the Holy Spirit, we should give ourselves entirely as self-gift to each other. By baptism we are plunged into that mystery of the Trinity and every time we celebrate the Mass we are swept into that communion of love. This is the mystery we celebrate today.

### First Holy Communion

First Holy Communion is an unforgettable event not only in the life of these children but their family and relations. We are all happy that through these loving children we receive manifold blessings from God and it will be continued as you take the trouble to bring the children regularly to the church and attend the Holy Mass on days of obligation.

Mass is all that matters for us Catholics. It is not merely a church service or another reason for a celebration. It is something the Catholics do together as family, young and old, men and women, brown and white. We are not just spectators of an event but participants in the celebrations of the death and resurrection of Jesus. Mass is like an onion, this sacred event embraces layer upon layer of our tradition and mystery of our faith lived out by millions of people before us. The gospel story tells us that Jesus, on the night before he died, had a meal with his young friends in Jerusalem. It was not an ordinary meal but a special dinner, one that would be his last, one that his followers would remember for the rest of their lives. Let us remember all these and celebrate this event meaningfully with our children and pray that their faith in the Eucharistic Lord, may be deepened day by day, week after week, year after year.
